

## HOUSEHOLD WASTE COLLECTION

A maximum of 70 gallons of household waste will be collected per Lot beginning at 7AM on Tuesday and Friday (Monday or Thursday if the collection day is a federal holiday). Two 35-gallon size trash cans are recommended.

Unacceptable items include: hazardous materials (such as gasoline, oil, paint, lawn chemicals), construction waste (such as lumber, drywall, brick), yard waste (such as leaves, clippings, branches), furniture, and white goods (such as refrigerators, microwaves). ## RECYCLABLE GLASS, PLASTIC & METAL



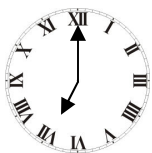
The following clean food and beverage containers, placed in a recycling bin or similar container, will be collected on Tuesday (Monday if the collection day is a federal holiday): glass of all colors (lids removed); Type 1 through 7 plastics; and steel, tin or aluminum metal. Crushing or flattening of plastic and metal containers is desired. Please place recyclables in closed bags (plastic grocery bags tied closed are OK).



Unacceptable items include: plate glass, light bulbs, mirrors, dishes, pottery, ceramics, windshields, plastic toys, dolls, plastic wrap, large buckets, pans or pails, plastic bags, or other non-food containers.

## RECYCLABLE PAPER & CARDBOARD

Clean and dry paper of all types, including paperback and hardback books, will be collected on Friday (Thursday if the collection day is a federal holiday). Newspapers, magazines, books and loose papers must be stacked and either bundled or placed in paper grocery bags. Cardboard boxes must be broken down flat, stacked and bundled into roughly a 3' x 3' size.



Place your trash cans and recycle bins at the end of the driveway by 7AM on collection day. Please refrain from putting your cans and bins out earlier than the evening prior. Please remove them from the street prior to the following morning.

## **FEDERAL HOLIDAYS**

Pick-ups occurring on federal holidays will be made the day prior. Calendar entries will be made on our website at [www.hnowa.org](http://www.hnowa.org) and e-mail updates sent out to remind residents of the earlier pick-up date. ## **CONTAINMENT OF WASTES & RECYCLABLES**

Department of Health regulations require that waste transported in open refuse hauling trucks be contained to prevent it from polluting the environment while in transit. Wastes that are not securely contained will not be picked up by our contractor. Trash bags (plastic grocery bags are OK) should be securely tied or sealed to prevent waste from spilling out while being handled by our contractor. Recyclables should also be contained in bags or bound as appropriate to assist our contractor in segregating household wastes and recyclables in a single truck load.

## **VEHICLE PARKING & OTHER TRAFFIC OBSTRUCTIONS**

Many of our side streets are only 20' wide. The average vehicle is 6' wide, or nearly 1/3<sup>rd</sup> of the road width. Please refrain from parking vehicles on the street or placing obstacles to traffic near the street on collection days. If you must park on the street, please park all vehicles on one side of the street as close to the edge as safely possible. Our contractor will not be penalized for a missed pick-up because he was blocked by cars or other obstructions on the street.

## **MISSED PICK-UP**

If you have a missed pick-up, please notify the Directors as soon as possible at [directors@hnowa.org](mailto:directors@hnowa.org) or by calling one of our numbers listed on the POC page of our website at [www.hnowa.org](http://www.hnowa.org) so that we may investigate and rectify the situation as soon as possible. Generally speaking, a missed pick-up will be made up within 24 hours unless extenuating circumstances prohibit. Our contractor will notify us as soon as possible if inclement weather, hazardous road conditions, or other abnormal conditions will result in a missed pick-up. We will relay this information to the e-mail update list as soon as possible.
